Wage Subsidy Program

This program provides an incentive for employers to hire individuals who have the education but lack work experience, by offsetting the cost of additional training through a wage subsidy.

First Nations Summer Career Placement Program

Financial assistance is provided towards the wage of a student and encourages employers to hire secondary and post secondary students for summer employment.
